# Stubbornness is not a fruit of the Spirit

#### Stubborn:

- 1. unreasonably determined: unreasonably and obstructively determined to persevere or prevail
- 2. dogged: carried out in a determined, persistent way; met with stubborn resistance
- 3. hard to remove: difficult to remove or deal with a stubborn stain

Thesaurus: obstinate, immovable, inflexible, willful, mulish, obdurate, intractable, pigheaded

antonym: flexible

Positive rendering: persistent, dogged, tenacious, persevering, determined, stalwart

### **Characteristics:**

- Self willed "I did it my way". Some people brag about their stubbornness
- Refusing to change
- Being unreasonable, leading to bad decisions, and in some cases wrong teaching
- Not receiving correction
- Un-teachable
- Controlling
- **Immaturity**
- Idolatry: Have a tendency to exalt themselves and their opinions

Self will and Stubbornness proceed from:

In God's eyes, rebelling against His commandments and doing things our own way is just like the sin of witchcraft. In vs. 22, we read, "Behold, to obey is better than sacrifice." God wants His people to have obedient hearts, and He is not interested in people who make a show of religious works and sacrifices.
